Revett Minerals and Federal Agencies agree to unprecedented protection package.

US Fish & Wildlife Service and US Forest Service developed several measures to protect grizzlies in Montana. The enhancement package includes:

- 2,450 acres of high-quality grizzly habitat will be protected from future development;
- Montana's Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks (FWP) will be able to hire two grizzly bear specialists for 30-plus years, at no cost to taxpayers or sportsmen;
- FWP will also be able to hire an additional law-enforcement officer for the area, again at no cost to taxpayers or sportsmen; and
- FWP, in concert with the Forest Service, will have additional money for grizzly education programs – at no cost to taxpayers or sportsmen.

Don't take our word, listen to Anne Vandehey from US Fish & Wildlife Service:

Vandehey said these collective conservation measures "will ultimately improve conditions for bears in the Cabinet-Yaak Ecosystem." And, she added, "We don't believe any other grizzly bear ecosystem has received this level of concerted or focused attention."



What makes this possible? Our Rock Creek mine!

What makes all these recovery measures possible is our proposed Rock Creek Mine in Sanders County. Rock Creek will be an underground copper-silver mine that will have a modest footprint and use state-of-art environmental protection technology. The mine will directly employ more than 250 Montanans for more than three decades, and will use a multi-stage water treatment plant to ensure excess water meets or exceed all state and federal regulations.
