In addition, the Agreement will provide local groups, elected officials, and individuals with an opportunity to participate in decisions about the project that may affect their local community, economy, or environment.

For example, if the plan calls for us to move part of the Rock Creek Road, rest assured we're

committed to working with our neighbors to make sure that what we do meets everyone's needs.

As part of this effort, we will be holding information meetings to keep our neighbors informed about the Project, and we're already meeting with local officials and groups to listen to their concerns.
